We are a non-profit organization most often working with other non-profits. Tell us about your event and we are happy to work with you on an estimated cost.

A typical weekend youth conference using our cabins will cost around \$80 person for the weekend, including housing, meals, and meeting space. An adult weekend retreat with private lodging and double occupancy will cost around \$90-100 per person for the weekend, including housing, meals, and meeting space. We will work with you on budgeting and provide a clear and itemized cost estimate.

There are four factors that determine the cost of an event at Camp Kuratli:

1. housing and/or day rates
2. meals
3. meeting rooms
4. additional costs

HOUSING

Camp Kuratli provides camp-style, semi-private, and private lodgings. In general, the smaller the group the more comfortably we can house you. The larger the group, the more “camp-like” it will feel.

Camp-Style Lodging:

Ideal for youth retreats, each cabin has two separate floors. Each cabin has bunks and a separate counselor's room. Does not include linens. Price is per person.	Regular Season March-October	Value Season November-February
